Savane: From Alleyways to Happiness




Little by little, he reached out. His tractor-like purrs replaced the loud meows of a stray, until the day he chose to step inside a carrier, opening the door to a new life.


Expenses

As this is our first operational quarter, a significant portion of our expenses went toward veterinary care for new intakes. To support this work, we temporarily relied on loans from board members. We anticipate this need to decrease as adoption fees and fundraising activities continue to generate stable revenue.



Revenues

Items under “Other Income” include additional veterinary care or supplies purchased by adopters through our rescue. As a new organization, most of our revenue this quarter came from adoption fees, with donations and fundraising beginning to grow. We expect these efforts to become a larger share of our revenue moving forward.
